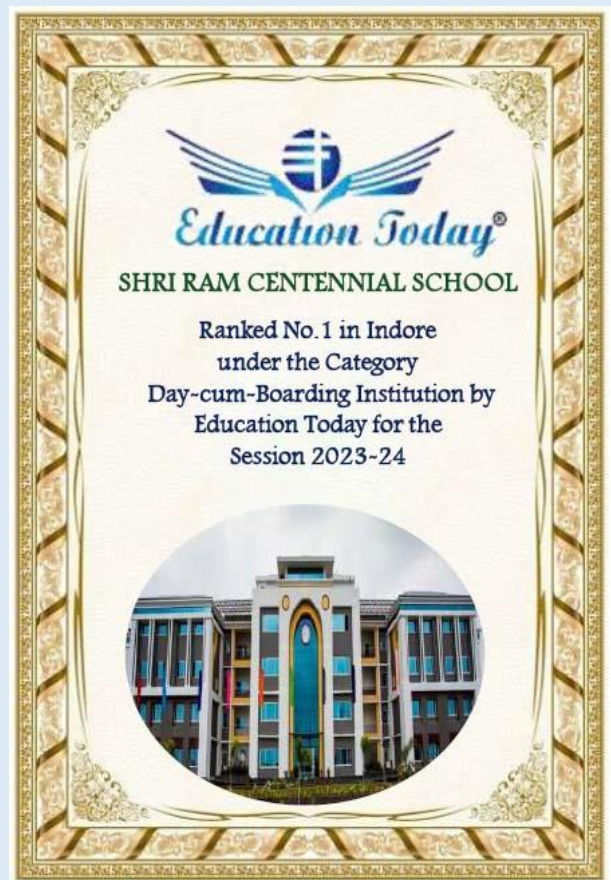
## **Shri Ram School Ranked No.1 by Education Today**

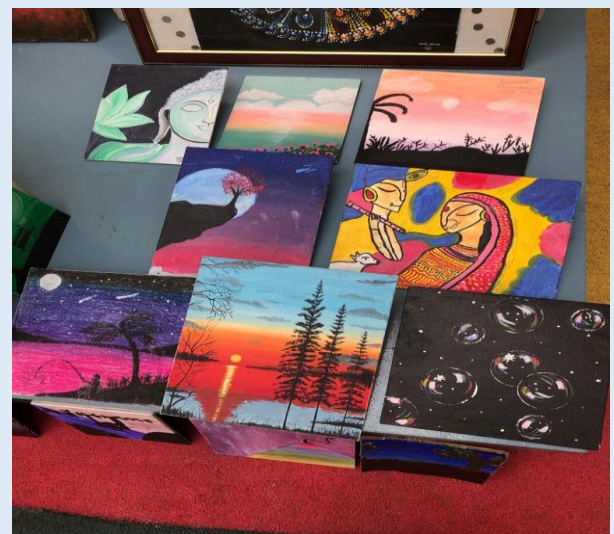


was a resounding success leaving a lasting impact on the students, broadening their perspectives, and instilling a sense of pride in India's rich cultural heritage.

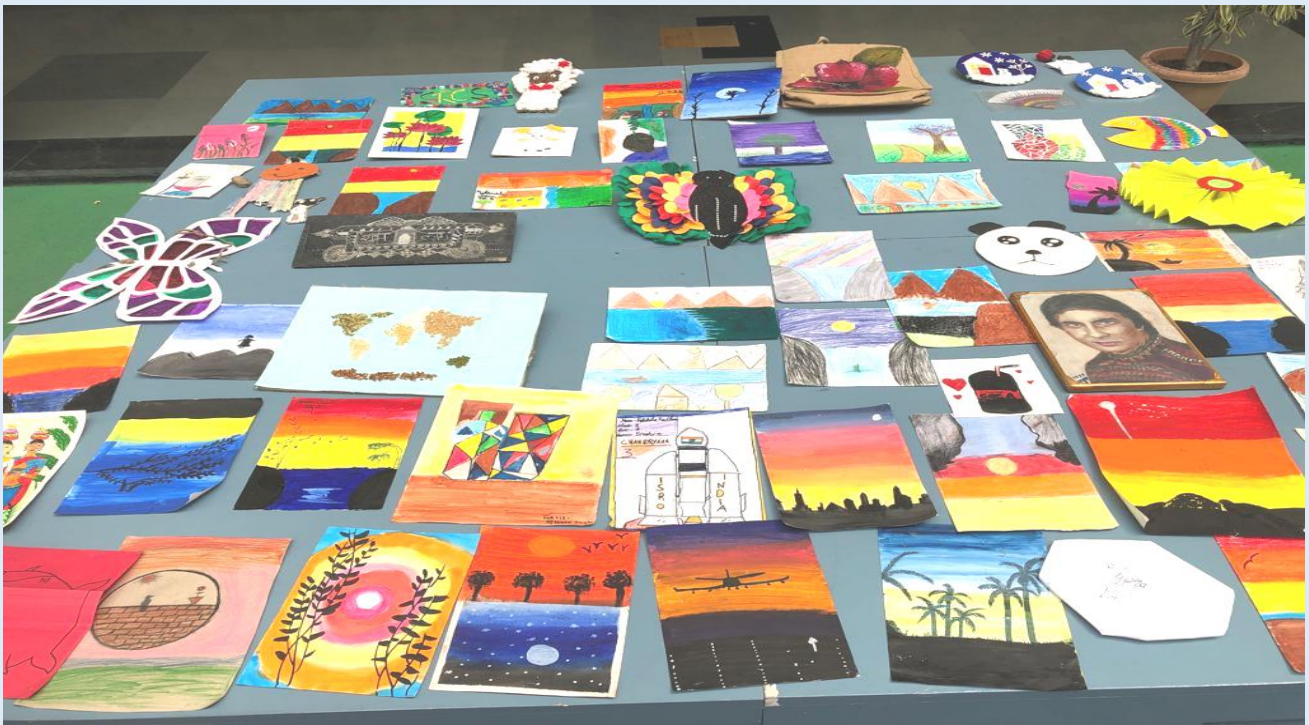
## Christmas Day Celebration
