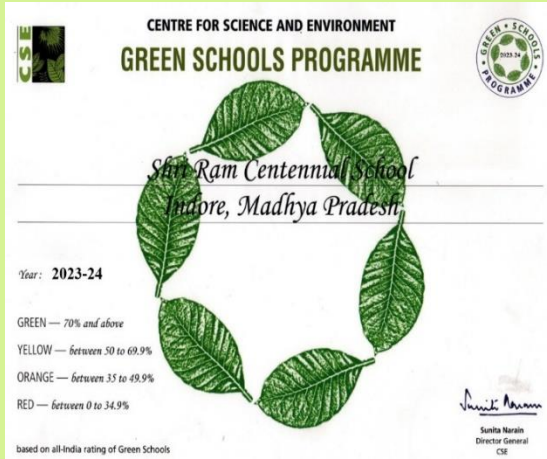

vision of nurturing future generations with a deep respect for nature and a commitment to a sustainable future.



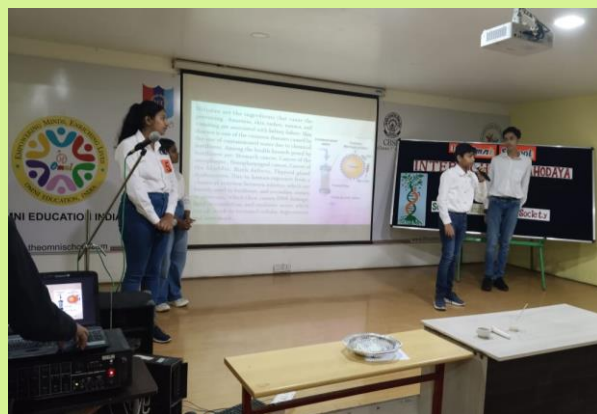
SRCian's Excel in Sahodaya Senior Bal Vigyan

That's how they know spring has come.

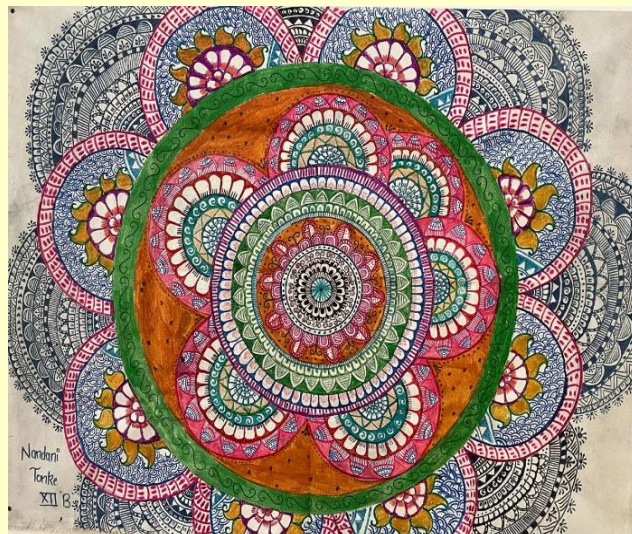

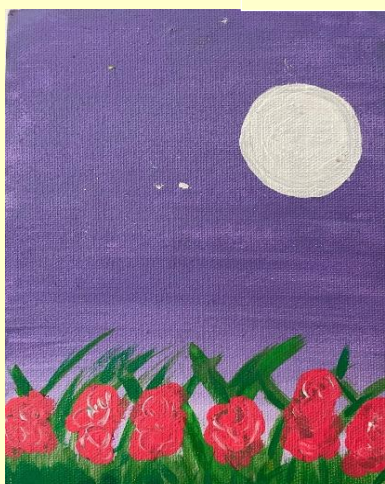
